Launch of the NIHR Programme Development Grants - competition 28

Programme Development Grants (PDG) are designed to enable a research team to carry out targeted preparatory work to develop a competitive Programme Grants for Applied Research (PGfAR) funding application. They can also be used to further develop an existing or ongoing PGfAR-funded programme of research.

Individual awards are for a maximum of £150,000 over a period of 12 to 24 months. The amount of funding awarded, however, is determined by the scale and nature of the research activity to be conducted.

Applications to PDG are made with the support of an NHS body and other providers of NHS services in England. **Deadline for proposals is**1.00 pm on 23 September 2020.

This scheme is designed to help nurses, midwives, allied health professionals, pharmacists and healthcare scientists to build the strongest possible applications for a PhD or a post-doctoral level fellowship primarily, though not exclusively, within the NIHR Integrated Clinical Academic (ICA) programme. To be eligible for one of these personal awards you must be about to complete a masters degree or PhD, hold a professional registration and have begun to develop a research profile within an NHS organisation.
